Free ESL Classes Finder Guide

The places that offer free and low-cost English classes - and exactly how to find them near you.



Find an English or language class with open eyes - then get matched, free, with welcoming, accredited schools near you. You compare programs and choose where to enroll.

You may not need to pay at all

Many adults learn English in the US for free or very little. The classes are real, taught by trained teachers, and open to newcomers. Here is where to look.

Where free classes come from

- Public libraries - free conversation groups and beginner classes.
- Community colleges - low-cost or free adult ESL programs.
- Adult schools and school districts - free evening ESL.
- Nonprofits and community centers - free classes, often with childcare.
- Places of worship and immigrant-support groups.



How to find them near you

- 1 Search your city name plus 'free ESL classes' or 'adult English classes'.
- 2 Call your local public library and ask about English classes.
- 3 Ask your community college about free or low-cost adult ESL.
- 4 Ask a local nonprofit or community center.
- 5 Or get matched, free, and let welcoming schools come to you.

What to ask about a free class

- What level is it, and is there a placement check?
- When and where does it meet, and how long is the term?
- Is registration required, and is there a waitlist?
- Is childcare or transportation help available?



Free vs paid - choosing

Free community classes are excellent for many learners. A paid school may offer more hours, smaller classes, or a faster schedule. Neither is automatically better - pick what fits your goal, your week, and your budget.
